

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Arenac County Fair Premium List - 2023

Fair Policies, Rules and Regulations

1. ALL EXHIBITS OPEN AND YOUTH MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED BY JULY 1ST. ALL ENTRY FORMS, COPIES OF REQUIRED TESTING AND FEES MUST ACCOMPANY REGISTRATION. ENTRY FORMS MAY BE MAILED TO:

MAY BE BROUGHT TO THE FAIR OFFICE ON FRIDAYS Starting JUNE 10 FROM 10 AM - 5 PM

Exhibitor tags may be picked up at the fair office on July 16th or 17th

- 2. All exhibitors must provide the last four digits of their Social Security Number when registering for the fair.
- 3. All exhibitors shall pay a \$1.00 per every 4 entries, except departments 15 which is \$3 youth and \$4 adult and department 92 B & C and open classes.
- 4. The fairgrounds will be open for the reception of exhibits on MONDAY of fair week from 12:00 to 6:45 pm for still exhibits and livestock. Horses will come in on Monday from 4:00-7:00 pm. Exhibits will be released from 12:00 to 3:00 pm on Sunday after the fair. Removal of any exhibit before release time (as stated above) will void any premium money awarded. The fair office will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. during the week of the fair.
- 5. Youth and Open class still exhibits will be displayed in separate buildings. Superintendents/Judges shall not exhibit in their departments.
- 6. THE YOUTH DIVISION IS OPEN TO ANY BOY OR GIRL FROM THE AGE OF 5-19, AND FFA MEMBERS UNTIL AGE 21. SPECIAL NEEDS MAY ENTER AT ANY AGE
- Fair age will be calculated by a child's age as of January 1st of the current fair year. ANIMAL YOUTH DIVISION IS OPEN TO ANY BOY OR GIRL FROM THE AGE OF 5-19.
- 8. All youth exhibits will be judged upon a Danish system of A, B, C basis and awards will be paid for each class. Open Class will be judged by the American System, 1, 2, 3 basis. Cloverleaf ages 5 & under will receive ribbons only.

9. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor and must be entered by the exhibitor.

- 10. Exhibits may only be displayed for one year.
- 11. Exhibits must be constructed in the year just prior to the fair.
- 12. Exhibitors will be limited to one exhibit per class.
- 13. Premium money will be paid only for classes listed in the book. Others may be displayed and ribbons awarded but no premiums will be paid.
- 14. There will be a \$100 dollar cap on premium money paid to an individual in the youth department excepting animal exhibits.
- 15. Premium money will be paid according to the judges' sheets and not by the ribbon attached to the exhibit.
- 16. Any exhibit deemed unworthy, will not be awarded a premium but no premium will be withheld merely because there is no competition. Judges shall award the premium according to the merit of the exhibit.

17. If the receipts of the fair are insufficient to pay premiums, The Agricultural Society shall pay all premiums awarded on a pro rated basis.

- 18. If the exhibit, including containers, are not picked up at the end of the fair, exhibitors shall forfeit their premium money.
- 19. Every article or animal upon the grounds for exhibit will be under control of the fair board.
- 20. The Fair Board will provide security starting on Tuesday and ending on Sunday morning from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. each night, but will not be responsible for loss, injury or damage by fire, lightning, wind or any other agency to such animal or article being exhibited and upon which condition all entries are accepted.
- 21. No guns or knives on the grounds.
- 22. No dogs except show dogs the day of the show, no bare feet, no unautho-

rized bikes, ATVs or golf carts allowed on the fairgrounds.

- 23. The Fair Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences. It further reserves the right to amend to or delete from these rules.
- 24. Failure to comply with the above rules and the rules of the various departments will cause forfeiture of premiums and the removal of the animal/exhibits from the fairgrounds at the owner's expense.

OPEN CLASS

- 25. Articles exhibited in open departments must be strictly homemade no mixes and must be the work of the exhibitor.
- 26. No state protected plants may be used.
- 27. A professional is someone who has received cash or goods in return for a specified article.

ANIMAL DIVISION

- 28. Exhibitors must own their market animal.
- 29. Animal exhibits will be entered into the barns on Monday from 4-7 and released on Sunday from 12-3. Horses will enter Monday 4-7 pm.
- 30. All Livestock exhibited must comply with the health requirements of the State of Michigan.
- 31. All MDA required testing will be enforced.
- 32. No exhibitor shall knowingly bring on the fairgrounds any animal which has behavior such as kicking or biting which could result in personal injury to fair patrons and that they shall be held liable for any such injury caused by such animal.
- 33. All animals must be healthy and free of disease.
- 34. All animals must be properly identified.
- 35. All exhibitors and parents must sign a stall agreement before admission of any animal into the barns.
- 36. Any youth exhibitors caught drinking, smoking or using illegal substances will be asked to vacate the premises and lose premiums and will be turned over to the authorities and cage/stall privileges will be permanently banned.
- 37. Market books are due to the fair office between 4-7 pm on Monday night. Project book for non-selling animals are to be entered on Monday also.
- 38. A complete listing of market/sale rules can be obtained at the MSU extension office.
- 39. Official weigh-in is the first day of the fair.
- 40. A complete listing of MDA state animal regulations may be obtained by downloading from www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibitinfo. A copy is also available in the fair office.

SHOWMANSHIP/SPORTSMANSHIP AND JUDGING FOR YOUTH

- 41. Showmanship ages for youth as of January 1, are as follows:
 - 5-7 PEEWEE
 - 8-12 JUNIOR
 - 13-15 INTERMEDIATE
 - 16-21 SENIOR
- 42. At least 3 people must show in showmanship for trophies to be awarded.
- 43. Expo showmanship does not receive a trophy.
- 44. The owner must exhibit each animal competing for a premium.
- 45. All market animals must be shown to qualify for premium money.
- 46. Exhibitors in showmanship must wear black bottoms (jeans or slacks) and a collared, button down style long sleeve blue shirts (Plaid or plain).
- 47. If an advanced person wins senior showmanship, two trophies will be awarded.
- 48. All exhibitors shall display proper sportsmanship and attitude to all people throughout the fair.
- 49. All participants must be available at the time of judging.
- 50. All animals must be groomed by the exhibitor not the parents.
- 51. The first place winner of the showmanship per age group can enter the super showmanship class.
- 52. It is the responsibility of the showmanship winners to go around to the different barns and ask for help in showing of the other animals.

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BARNS

- 53. Superintendents are in charge of assigning cages/stalls.
- 54. All cages/must have a water source (i.e. bottle, bowl).
- 55. All animals must receive fresh water daily.
- 56. Cages are to be locked with an extra key made and given to the superintendent for problems in case of an emergency.
- 57. Cages/stalls are to be properly cleaned before 10:00 am each day and waste deposited at the proper site, including stale water.
- 58. No animal will be placed into a cage/stall without it first being checked over by the superintendent.
- 59. Feeding times for animals are as follows: before 10:00 am each morning and between the hours of 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm
- 60. No food/pails will be stored in the barns during the fair.
- 61. No sleeping in the barns.
- 62. No motor vehicles allowed in the barns.
- 63. No smoking in the barns.
- 64. Each exhibitor is responsible to sign-up for barn duty. A list is posted in each
- 65. Championship classes are open to first place prize winners in each class of the same sex.
- 66. Exhibitors must place their names and addresses, also the breed name and age of each animal exhibited, upon a card in a conspicuous place in the stall.
- 67. All livestock must meet the state health requirements for exhibition.
- 68. The barns and exhibit halls will be closed for judging.
- 69. Superintendents shall weigh in the animals in their department. All scales must be open to public viewing.

CATTLE/DAIRY

- 70. Must have RFID electronic identification ear tags.
- 71. Must provide written proof of negative TB testing.
- 72. Cows giving milk must be milked regularly during the fair. Milking times will be 9a.m. and 8 p.m. daily and will take place in the arena if the superintendent wishes for safety reasons.
- 73. Get of sire consists of four animals, any age, both sexes to be represented, get of one sire. The sire must be named.

DOGS

Obedience and Agility will be divided into three classes (Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced).

- All (A) classes are for first year trainers and dogs.
- All (B) classes are for trainers and dogs who have competed in a class previously, or second and third year trainers and dogs.
- 74. Classes will be judged on 4-H rules, but, you do not have to be in 4-H to enter the dog show.
- 75. Dogs must be healthy and free from disease, copies of current vaccination for Rabies, DHLPP, Bordatella, and current dog license required. NO EXCEPTIONS.

- 80. Exhibitors must ren to the start of the show.
- 81. Any dog that leaders / superintendent deem to be unsafe will be unable to exhibit at the Arenac County Fair.
- 82. Anyone seen punishing or abusing their dog will be dismissed immediately.
- 83. The decision of the judge is final.

DRESS CODE - DOGS

- 84. Exhibitors in Obedience and Agility should be neatly dressed for dog shows, dress slacks, or shorts to the knee with dress shirt or blouse or polo shirt.
- 85. Exhibitors in Showmanship must wear black pants and a long white shirt.
- 86. Exhibitors must wear flat shoes. No open toe shoes or sandals. No jeans, t-shirts, halter/tank tops, mini skirts, short-shorts, jewelry or sweatshirts.

- 87. Must have official USDA Scrapie identification.
- 88. Altered males allowed.

HORSES

Mandatory barn meeting at 7 pm on Monday night of haul-in.

- 89. Age determination will be as follows: Adult- 20 and over, Senior- 16 to 19, Junior- 13 to 15, Young Junior- 9 to 12 and Pee Wee- 5 to 8. Fair age is calculated by a child's age as of January 1st of the current fair year.
- 90. Proof of a negative Coggins test must be turned in with entry form as well as displayed on the horse's stall.
- 91. Stalls will be awarded to 4-H horse club members first. Any extra stalls will be awarded on the first come basis. All stalls must be occupied before hauling in will be permitted. Contact horse superintendent with any questions regarding hauling in or horse superintendent will contact haul in registrants if they can not haul in. Stall fee of \$5.00 will be charged.
- 92. Limit 2 horses per person for stalls, unless authorized by horse superintendent.
- 93. No stalls available on show day.
- 94. No grooming in the aisle of the barn.
- 95. Stallions born before January 1st, of the current year, may not be shown in the youth division, but can be shown by an adult - 20 and over.
- 96. Animals are to be led to and from the warm-up arena at all times. No one is to be astride a horse outside the riding arena.
- 97. Saw dust will be provided for bedding within the horse barn. No straw is to
- 98. Exhibitors must furnish their own buckets, feeding containers, tie ropes, etc.

99. Only one horse per person per class during the youth show unless horse is ridden by another family member.

- 100. Classes will be judged by current 4-H rules http://msue.anr.msu.edu/resources/michigan 4 h horse pony project show rules regulations.
- 101. Electric timer will be used for speed events.
- 102. Any alterations made to equipment or to person to aid in the performance of the rider or the horse while in the show ring will not be permitted and disqualification from the class will result.
- 103. Tie downs must not cut off horse's wind.
- 104. Back cinches must be properly adjusted and connected.
- 105. No excessive whipping, spurring and/or striking of your horse, especially in front of the girth, will be tolerated. Disqualification will result.
- 106. All horses being exhibited in the Youth Pleasure show, must participate in a fitting and showing class that day.
- 107. In the Youth Show, High Point and Reserved High Point will be awarded in the Pleasure and Speed/Gymkhana events. Awards will be given for each of the four age divisions – Senior- 16 to 19, Junior- 13 to 15, Young Junior- 9 to 12 and Pee Wee- 5 to 8.
- 108. Pleasure High Point and Reserved High Point will include classes 440 480 on page 17 (See Youth Pleasure Show Bill)
- 109. Speed/Gymkhana High Point and Reserved High Point will include classes 482-505 on page 17. (See Youth Speed/Gymkhana Show Bill)
- 110. In case of a tie for High Point Pleasure or Speed Gymkhana, an equitation test and/or questions will take place using one of the following:
- a. Test #1: Ride a figure 8 with lead change.
- b. Test #2: Back, Walk, Trot/Jog, Canter/Lop. (Judge will define the test)
- c. Test #3: Question on tack or parts of the horse, etc.
- 111. Costume class is to be judged on originality. Please write a short description of your costume and turn it in to the announcer prior to the start of the class.

OPEN HORSE SHOW (additional to the General Horse Rules stated above)

- 112. Ribbons will be awarded through 6th place and premiums will be paid through 3rd place only.
- 113. The horse show superintendent reserves the right to combine or split classes when entries warrant.

POULTRY - Meat Weight Limit (Chickens 5lb., Ducks 6lb., Turkeys 20lb.)

- 114. Must be banded. (Except Pheasants).
- 115. Must provide written proof of Pullorum-typhoid testing.
- 116. Owners must bring birds to the table.
- 117. All poultry must be cleaned and dusted upon entry or they will be refused.

RABBITS

- 118. Must be tattooed.
- 119. No clipping or powdering of rabbits allowed.
- 120. Owners must bring rabbits to the table.

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SHEEP

121. Lambs must have official USDA Scrapie identification.

SWINE

122. Must be tagged (with MDARD NUES tags).

POCKET PETS

- 124. Exhibitor is responsible to read the general rules.
- 125. Only pre-registered animals will be allowed to compete.
- 126. Each animal may only enter in one class.
- 127. Pocket pets must be kept in a proper cage until their class is ready.
- 128. The exhibitor is responsible for getting their animal to the judges table.
- 129. The exhibitor will supply their own cage with secure lids for each animal.
- 130. Exhibitors will be asked questions about the care of their animal.
- 131. Exhibitor must be able to handle and control their animal. If the exhibitor is unable to control their animal the superintendent has the right to excuse the exhibitor
- 132. Pocket pets must be in the care of the exhibitor for at least 4 months prior to the fair.

ANIMAL DRUG TESTING POLICY AND PROCEDURES

PURPOSE: To insure, to the best of our ability that all animals shown at the Arenac County Fair are free from drug enhancing substances.

Authority: Michigan Animal Industry Act No. 466, public Acts 1988, Section 40 as amended.

POLICY: The Arenac County Agricultural Society reserves the right to randomly drug test any animal entered in the Arenac County Fair for competition. Testing may occur at the time of entry, during the fair, and after competition has been completed. Such testing may be done by either the collection of urine or blood samples or both at the discretion of the Fair Veterinarian. All testing will be under the supervision of the fair Veterinarian.

The Arenac County Agricultural Society reserves the right to disqualify any animals, either live or slaughtered wherein the Exhibitor/Owner of the animal entered into competition refuses to allow the animal to be tested, or the animal fails the drug testing for substances not approved by the Food and Drug Administration and the United States Department of Agriculture or the Michigan Department of Agriculture. This includes, but is not limited to diuretics, steroids, repartitioning agents, tranquilizers, and analgesic. Exhibitors will notify the fair veterinarian before administering any medications to any animal brought in for competition.

Should the testing results prove positive, the Arenac County Agricultural Society reserves the right to, and may disqualify the animal from all placing, trophies, ribbons, premiums and awards: confiscation of the animal in question; and notification of test results to the livestock sale committee.

All premium monies will be forfeited and returned to the fair office if received prior to the testing results being returned from the State Laboratory.

PROCEDURE: In the event that the Arenac County Agricultural Society feels that drug testing is necessary because of the suspicious nature of an animal's actions or upon a written complaint based on personal knowledge to the board of directors that an animal has been injected with or has been given a prohibited substance, the fair veterinarian will be notified and the following procedures will be performed:

- 1. The exhibitor and in the event of a minor, the exhibitor and his or her parents or legal guardian will be advised that the animal in question is to be tested and why it is to be tested. They will be asked to sign a testing release form and be present during the actual collection procedures. The actual collection of the samples will be performed by the Fair Veterinarian and placed and sealed by him or her in the appropriate collection containers as provided by the Michigan Department of Agriculture.
- 2. The samples shall then be taken or mailed directly to the Michigan Department of Agriculture for testing. The Exhibitor and in the event of a minor, the exhibitor and his or her parents or legal guardian will then be notified as to the results of the testing by the Arenac County Agricultural Society Board of Directors. Should the test results come back positive. The exhibitor and in the event of a minor, the exhibitor and his or her parents or legal guardian will then be notified as to what action or actions may be taken by the Arenac County Fair Board of Directors.
- 3. Should an exhibitor and in the case of a minor, the exhibitor and or his or her parents or legal guardian refuse to permit such testing, the Arenac County Agri-

cultural Society reserves the right to take whatever action it may deem necessary up to and including the removal of all placings, awards, premiums and future showing and exhibiting rights in future competitions and fairs.

GRIEVANCE POLICY

An exhibitor compelled to bring a complaint regarding conflict of interest of the judge, disqualification of an exhibit or exhibitor, group leader or superintendent's behavior or eligibility of an exhibit shall make a formal protest in writing to the Fair Board Executive Committee no later than ten days following the end of fair. All protests shall be referred to a special committee, which shall review the protest with interested parties and give parties an opportunity to submit evidence. Report of findings shall be made to the fair board for final decision on the protest. The party against whom the protest was filed shall have the right to read the statement of protest. Exhibitor may file appeal to the Department of Agriculture within 45 days of filing the initial complaint if the exhibitor is not satisfied with the association's action. The Department of Agriculture shall have 60 days after receipt of any appropriately filed appeal to investigate the complaint, and shall issue a finding of fact and notice of department action and any recommended actions for the association.

CAMPING POLICY

- A. Camping is limited to active exhibitors and their families.
- B. All campers MUST check in with the campground superintendent upon arrival. Campground superintendent has the final say on placement of campers. Any campers not parked in the proper location, as assigned by the campground superintendent, will be subject to having their trailer/camper towed at the owner's expense. Owners will hold the Arenac County Fair harmless for any damage sustained to their trailer/camper while being towed
- C. No more than two vehicles are permitted per campsite. Any campsite with more than two vehicles on site will have the additional cars towed at the owner's expense. Owners will not hold the Arenac County Fair harmless for any damage incurred.
- D. Campers must take their garbage to designated dumpsters. Any camper leaving the campsite dirty will be fined.
- E. No campfires are allowed on the Fairgrounds.
- F. All awnings will face north if possible.
- G. All electrical cords must be the same gauge as provided with recreational vehicle.
- H. No excessive use of electricity will be allowed.
- I. No water hook ups.
- J. All children must be in the supervision of an adult over the age of 21 while camping.
- K. All children must be at their campsite by 12:00 a.m. No wondering the grounds. L. No dogs allowed on the fairgrounds.
- M. Payment of \$60.00 must be received by July 1st or campsite will be forfeited. After July 1st cost of site is an additional \$10.00. Cost of campsite comes with 2 family passes, this will supersede the buy one get one free for animal passes. N. Campsite reservations can be made by sending the form on page 40 and payment by July 1st to:

- O. Camping sites will be issued on a first-come first-served basis.
- P. Camping permit must be put in a visible window facing west.

REFUND POLICY: No refund will be given once any event or show has started.

GENERAL

Exhibitors at state, county, and district fairs, along with other livestock exhibitions, expositions, and shows are required to comply with all of the statutory and regulatory provisions of the State of Michigan relating to animal health outlined in Act No. 466 of the Public Acts of 1988, as amended, and rules promulgated for the implementation and enforcement of the act. Copies may be obtained at www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibition or from the fair office.

- 1. Camping is limited to active exhibitors and their families.
- 2. All campers must check in with the camping superintendent upon arrival. Campground superintendent has the final say on placement of campers. Any campers not parked in the proper location, as assigned by the campground superintendent, will be subject to having their trailer/camper towed at their own expense. Owners will hold the Arenac County Fair harmless for any damage sustained to their trailer/camper while being towed.
- 3. No more than two vehicles are permitted per campsite. Any campsite with more than two vehicles on site will have the additional cars towed at the owner's expense. Owners will hold the Arenac County Fair harmless for any damage incurred while being towed or while on the fairgrounds.
- 4. Campers must take their garbage to designated dumpsters. Any camper leaving the campsite dirty will be fined and may be asked to leave the fairgrounds.
- 5. No campfires are allowed on the fairgrounds.
- 6. All awnings will face north if possible.
- 7. All electrical cords must be the same gauge as provided with recreational vehicles.
- 8. No excessive use of electricity will be allowed.
- 9. No water hook-ups.
- 10. All children must be in the supervision of an adult over the age of 21 while camping.

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
